## What happens when we die?

Christians believe that after death God will judge them for the deeds they have done during their lifetime. Christians believe that all humans have a soul. ## Charity

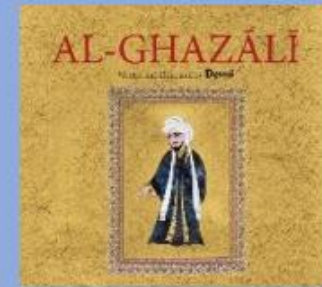
Muslims believe it is important to help the community to create peace and harmony. Muslims also feel it is their duty to give money to charity. Zakah is one of the Five Pillars of Islam, and every adult Muslim who can afford it must donate a portion of their wealth to charity each year (£1 from every £40, 2½%). Islamic Relief and Muslim Aid are two of the biggest Muslim charities in the UK.

'Be steadfast in prayer and regular in charity. And whatever good you send out before you, you shall find it with Allah: for Allah sees all that you do.'

## Mosques

The first mosques built in the UK:

The earliest recorded mosque in Britain was founded in a Liverpool terrace house in 1889.



The Shah Jahan Mosque at Woking was Britain's first purpose-built mosque. It was established in 1889.



Over the last 125 years, more and more mosques have opened: there are about 1750 in 2016.

The Prophet said "Whoever builds a mosque for Allah - though it be the size of the ground nest of a sandgrouse - Allah will build for him a house in Paradise."

### Dharma

In Hinduism, 'dharma' means duty, religion, virtue and morality; it is a central part of a Hindu's daily life. Hindus believe that there are right and wrong ways to behave so they must behave correctly, follow the moral law and take their duties seriously. It is everyone's dharma to be kind, honest, and religious and to be a good person in society.

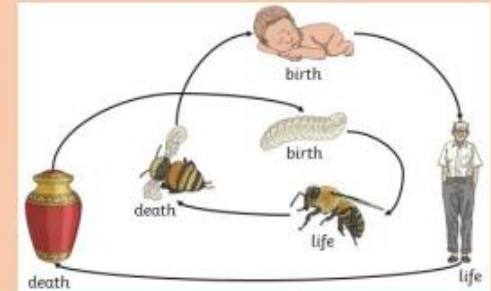

### What happens when you die?

Hindus believe in reincarnation. Reincarnation is the belief that life is a cycle of birth, life, death and rebirth. When a person dies, they are then reborn as another living thing. They believe our actions in this life, our "karma", effects our future incarnations. Kindness leads to good karma, whilst selfishness leads to bad karma. The soul may be reincarnated thousands of times. The end of the cycle is called Moksha, which can be reached if you live the best life you possibly can. It makes you at one with God and sets you free from having to be reborn on this Earth again. Bodies are burnt after death, to symbolise the quick release of the soul to begin its next life.



### Sewa

Sewa is selfless service to humanity. Service to God may include worship. Service to humans may include giving money to charity or looking after those in need. Acts of sewa must always be selfless - acts of kindness without expectation of anything in return.

Sewa UK is a non-profit organization committed to working in areas which



suffer from humanitarian disasters and tragedies and help to rebuild devastated communities.

### Gandhi

Gandhi was a Hindu who believed in and was committed to the principle of **ahimsa**, meaning harmlessness or non-violence. Gandhi hoped to win people over by changing their hearts and minds, and advocated non-violence in all things. He himself remained a committed Hindu throughout his life, but was critical of all faiths.
