

Charity


Muslims believe it is important to help the community to create peace and harmony. Muslims also feel it is their duty to give money to charity. Zakah is one of the Five Pillars of Islam, and every adult Muslim who can afford it must donate a portion of their wealth to charity each year (£1 from every £40, 21/2%). Islamic Relief and Muslim Aid are two of the biggest Muslim charities in the UK.



What happens when you die?

Hindus believe in reincarnation. Reincarnation is the belief that life is a cycle of birth, life, death and rebirth. When a person dies, they are then reborn as another living thing. They believe our actions in this life, our "karma", effects our future incarnations. Kindness leads to good karma, whilst selfishness leads to bad karma.

The soul may be reincarnated thousands of times. The end of the cycle is called Maksha, which can be reached if you live the best life you possibly can. It makes you at one with God and sets you free from having to be reborn on this Earth again. Bodies are burnt after death, to symbolise the quick release of the soul to begin its next life.

Sewa is selfless service to humanity.

Service to God may include worship.

Service to humans may include giving money to charity or looking after those in need. Acts of sewa must always be selfless - acts of kindness without expectation of anything in return.
