
Christmas Cards

ATTENDANCE

As a school we have clear procedures in place to monitor and track the attendance of your children.

Our school Attendance Officer works hard to ensure that these procedures are carefully followed and implemented in order to avoid involvement from our allocated Education Welfare Officer.

It is the responsibility of parents/families to contact the school whenever their child is absent.

If school is unaware of the reason for absence your child will receive an unauthorised mark in school. Patterns and trends will be monitored and if we have concerns about the number of absences or attendance drops below 96% then contact will be made with families. Where this does not improve actions will be taken and concerns will be shared with our Education Welfare Officer (EWO).

It is important that where possible any medical appointments or dental check-ups are made out of school hours.

Medical evidence will be requested if an appointment is in the school day.
